Interested Students:

Thank you for your interest in the Latinas in Progress© Education Seminar Series (LIP/ESS) sponsored by the Hispanic Women's Network of Texas (HWNT) Dallas Chapter. This information packet has the details about the education series to which we are inviting you to participate. HWNT has a genuine commitment to educating young women and we want the participants of our series to continue their education after graduating high school.

Are you eligible for this program?

Young women entering 9th through 12th grade in the fall 2018 are encouraged to apply. Students everywhere are eligible to participate, regardless of their place of residence. Criterion for selection is based on academic performance, extra-curricular activities, community service, and student commitment is equally important. HWNT seeks Seniors with minimum GPA requirement; and wish to obtain a higher education and are capable with appropriate support and mentoring.

Interested students must submit an application to the program by the announced deadline of **October 18, 2019**. Once accepted, students will receive an acceptance letter. Participation in all mandatory seminars of the program is expected from each student. Refer to the timeline in this packet for more information on the seminars.

Benefits to you:

- Access to the best academic institutions in the area, with exclusive 'Latinas in Progress' only campus tours.
- Information about scholarships and special programs from different organizations, corporations, colleges, and universities.
- Participating senior students are eligible to apply for HWNT's scholarships/awards for college in 2020.
- Enrollment into the MANA Hermanitas® Mentorship program for coaching and guidance throughout the year.
- Invitation to HWNT's events and community events including government, civic, and professional organizations in the area.
- Interaction with other young Latina leaders.

Scholarships:

Participating senior students who attend all four mandatory seminars are eligible to apply for scholarships. Scholarships are awarded based on seminar participation, academic performance, intended university and financial need. An average of 5 scholarships is awarded every academic year and awards range from \$500 to \$5,000. Scholarship winners are strongly encouraged to participate in student panels during the seminar series the year after their graduation to encourage students to continue their educational endeavors. To ensure the integrity of the program, scholarship awards require students to be enrolled in college and matriculation is verified at the bursar's office.

Mentorship:

As a participant, you have access to established professional women who serve as mentors during the duration of the program. Mentorship relationships foster confidence, allow learning through role modeling, and offer valuable advice and support to participants. Mentors interact and communicate with mentees to ensure retention in our program and aid with college preparation.

We encourage you to apply only if you can commit to attend <u>at least three</u> sessions (Orientation is Mandatory and parents are encouraged to join you).

Your daughter may be eligible to participate in the Latinas in Progress© Education Seminar Series (LIP/ESS)
The Hispanic Women's Network of Texas (HWNT), Dallas Chapter developed the program Latinas in Progress© Education Seminar Series (LIP/ESS) which is designed to encourage young women in high school to explore higher education through learning experiences that provide information and access to opportunity, financial resources.

Background

In 1989, the Dallas Chapter of HWNT created the LIP/ESS program with the aid of a grant from the Women's Center of Dallas. Administered by members, the Education Seminar Series has become the flagship program of the Dallas Chapter and has been incorporated into all of the HWNT chapters throughout the state of Texas.

Description of the Program

HWNT-Dallas' education seminar series strives to familiarize participants with college life and the tools to succeed in their personal and professional life. The Education Seminar Series is a series of free seminars hosted at local universities and colleges. LIP/ESS is designed to encourage young women to stay in school and continue on to college. In addition to helping students prepare for college, the program also incorporates detailed sessions about financial aid opportunities and career exploration. The seminars are designed to build leadership skills, life skills, and personal development through the use of workshops. Finally, the students are exposed to positive role models through career panels, student panels and mentorship

Requirements for Student Acceptance to the Program

Young woman entering **10th through 12th grade** in the Fall 2019 are encouraged to apply. Students must be enrolled in high school. Interested students must submit an application and a parental consent form to the program by the announced deadline. Once accepted, students will receive an acceptance letter. Participation in all of the sessions of the program is expected from each student. Criterion for selection is based on academic performance, extra-curricular activities, community service, and student commitment is equally important. HWNT seeks students who wish to obtain a higher education and are capable with appropriate support and mentoring.

Scholarships

Senior students who attend all mandatory seminars are eligible for scholarships. To receive a scholarship the student must submit an application by the deadline set in the Spring 2020. Scholarships are awarded based on seminar participation, academic performance, intended university and financial need. An average of 5 scholarships is awarded every academic year and awards range from \$500 to \$5,000.

Mentorship:

Participants have access to established professional women as mentors during the duration of the program. Mentorship relationships foster confidence, allow learning through role modeling, and offer valuable advice and support to participants. Mentors interact and communicate with mentees to ensure retention in our program and aid with college preparation.

Universities and College Institutions

Typically, seminars are held on Saturdays on the campus of a community college or university. Host colleges and universities have the opportunity to interact with college candidates and allow them to tour their facilities and learn about their programs.

The seminars usually start at 8:00 a.m. and go through 1:00 p.m., at the latest. Breakfast and activities are provided free to the student. Students are to provide their own transportation, so please encourage your daughter to arrive safely and on time to each session. There will be transportation available to session which occur outside of the DFW area.

Southern Methodist University/University of Dallas, Irving, Tx/University of Texas at Dallas/University of Texas at Arlington/Texas Woman's University/ Texas A&M Commerce/Dallas County Community Colleges

Your support is imperative for your daughter to be able to complete the series successfully.
